TAXATION FIGURES

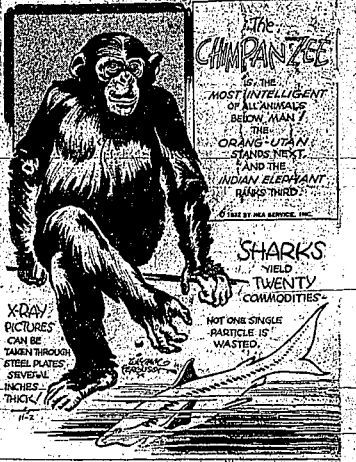
