THE ELECTION

Although it is too early to analyse the results of the election Tuesday, which resulted so overwhelmingly victorious for the Democratic party in nation, state and county, the outstanding note appears to be the unanimity with which the American people embraced that party in this period of stress.

This emphasizes all the more the responsibility which will rest on its nominees who are to assume officialdom.

Although it was inevitable that one-half or more of the candidates of the several parties are defeated at any election, this newspaper cannot at this time forego the opportunity of extending its tribute to these persons, quite as much as to successful candidates. All of them worked valiantly in their honest purpose to achieve success. That all of these did not accomplish this purpose, was not necessarily because of any individual shortcoming, but apparently on account of the manifested intent of the electorate to utilize to the full the benefits of complete party responsibility.

The people have spoken in no uncertain terms for the Democratic party, which while not entirely unexpected, is reassuring because of the knowledge that this political organization not only has the capacity to assume the responsibility now placed upon it, but has the heart and the will to live up to the highest ideals expected of it.

OVERLOOKING THE AMATEUR

Football and bridge seem to be two games that can never stay put. The rules in each pastime have a way of changing from year to year, and today neither game is very much like what it was 25 years ago; and in each case there is a suspicion that some of the changes, at least, were designed to benefit the teachers of the game rather than the players.

A few decades ago there was a card game called whist, and a very good game it was. Then it turned into bridge, and a little later it became auction bridge. Then, if became contract bridge, and now contract itself is evolving, and what the whole thing will be ten years from now, no man can tell.

All of this, very likely, is fine stuff for the experts, but what of the ordinary player, who plays occasionally for diversion but who doesn't quite care to make the game his life work? A few more changes and he is apt to give up in disgust and go back to poker, or pinochle, or something.

RIOTS, BUT NO KILLINGS

The more one reads about the unemployment riots in London, the more one is compelled to admit that the English do know how to run a police force.

Few police departments ever were put to a more severe test than the London bobbies got during these riots. They had to stand fast and use their clubs for all they were worth, and they did so very effectively. And while the spectacle of a thousand cops clubbing frantic fellow citizens is not pleasant, the fact that the officers did their job without using any weapons more dangerous than night-sticks is worth remembering.

A similar riot in an American city—or for that matter, in the ordinary European city—would have brought out riot guns, pistols, tear gas bombs, cavalry and platoons of infantry. Unless all bands were extremely lucky, a good many lives would have been lost. The London police seem to have the knack of doing a disagreeable job with firmness but without brutality.

WASTE AND EDUCATION!

Thousands of young people enrolled in American colleges and universities today have no business to be here, and would serve both themselves and the institutions involved if they withdrew and gave up all thoughts of getting any more education.

This is the statement of Dr. Albert A. Heckel, dean of men at the University of Missouri, in a recent interview. Anyone who has ever bothered to look into the matter will be inclined to agree with him.

That, of course, does not mean that a college education should be withheld from any ambitious and deserving youngster. What it does mean is that thousands of youngsters are in college today simply because they have a notion that it is the correct thing to do. They don't want to be educated; they simply like the wheels and waste the efforts of the institution they attend. A sharp drop in college enrollment figures would probably be a very healthy indication.

In his later campaign speech Hoover was termed the "honest Quaker." Now let's see—weren't those old Quakers supposed to take it on the chin and then turn the other cheek?
