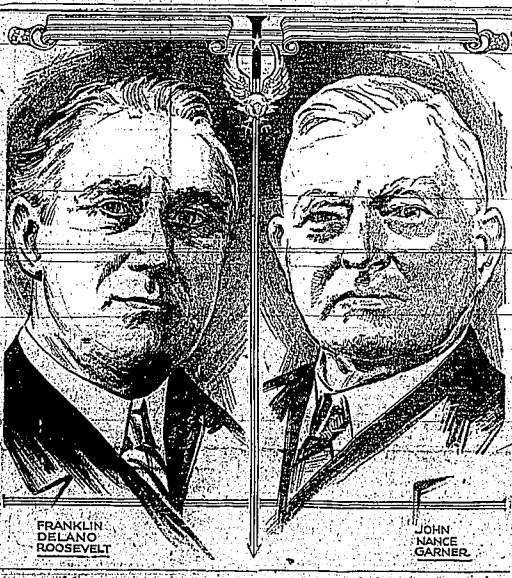
GOVERNOR ROSS (UP) - Incomplete returns from 42 of Idaho's 49 precincts show Roosevelt 51,127 to Hoover's 39,373, Pope 47,156 to Thomas' 32,830 and Ross 41,908 to Coffin 32,974. Other Democratic State candidates were leading throughout by apparently safe margins.

NEW YORK (UP) - Gov. Franklin D. Roosevelt has been elected president of the United States in a Democratic landslide, he won the highest office in the land with what appears to be the greatest electoral majority in history.

The Democratic victory also swept the party into control of both houses of Congress, with a majority in the middle. A depression-weary people inspired President Hoover, he won an average of defeat greater even than the defeat of Alfred E. Smith four years ago.
