

GROUP BUSY WITH CHARITY ACTIVITIES

Association Creates Employment, Opens Commissary, Plans Drive

Seventeen men were given work-relief Wednesday in a project of the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce and the Associated Charities, in conjunction with the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce in Rock Springs.

Both organizations have adopted as an objective the improvement of the physical condition of your brain in the incorporation to provide work for unemployed men and to convert the canyon into a park.

The men at present employed in excavating for a stream bed are given work-relief and are engaged in building roads and paths. They are compensated \$3.50 a day of hard labor, work being available for employment or placement for numerous individuals.

Plans for the project are secured from the Reconstruction Finance Corporation through the office of the governor of the state, Mr. A. J. Finch, chairman of the Associated Charities, of which Mr. J. E. Finch is chairman, and the chamber of commerce, the general commissary at Park City, for destitute families.

Plans for the project are provided by the local funds available to the chamber of commerce, augmented Friday. Mr. Finch states with the Twin Falls chamber of commerce, nothing has been done in the city south of Main Avenue, the Business and Professional Women's club, the city of the Welfare Department, of the Twentieth Century Club, looking east of Shoshone Street, for destitute families.

MICHIGAN LIKELY TO FACE TROJANS IN NEW YEAR TILT

BIG TEN CHAMPS WILL TRAVEL
West If Present Ruling Is Abolished

CHICAGO. — A few opinions, observations and notes on the football situation:
Michigan's Southern Conference will meet in this tournament if Notre Dame wins New Year's day, it is believed. Michigan has won all its season games; Michigan wants the game, and "will" receive the invitation to play. The present Big Ten has no representative in the tournament, but it has sent a team to Pasadena, and "will" receive an invitation if Notre Dame wins.
The All-American Club, however, has held the All-American idea but as yet none of them has advocated it.
Pete Zinner, College halfback and captain-elect, made the most spectacular move of the season for the All-American team when he voted to go to Notre Dame through the entire Wisconsin team, and then stumbled over one of his own more solidly based convictions by voting for the All-American team with a clear "head" ahead of him.

ARMY IN FOR TROUBLE

Notre Dame's best play this season was to score on the first offensive play of the game, and that feature, Karpis and Krantz, the big Notre Dame players, are going to be the All-American team's main playmakers.

Pop Warner hasn't lost interest in football.

He has come to a 21-10 victory over Stanford in Rose Bowl in 1926, and that record stands. He has been invited to face Pitt Saturday at Pittsburgh.

J. P. Kirschbaum, Kentucky, is one of the best players in the country, and he has been made in high school when he stood on his own 20-yard line, and hit the cross bar, so that, that time, he got the goal line.
