Japanese Delegate Assails Propaganda and League of Nations Stand
REGIME'S DISSOLUTION REQUESTED BY DR. YEN
Asks Countries Not to Recognize New Government of Manchukuo

GENEVA (UP)—Chinese propaganda and the attitude of the League of Nations were held chiefly responsible for the difficulty for eastern situation today by Japanese delegate Yonaka Matsukata at the Manchurian conference.

Dr. Yen requested the assembly to declare that Japan had violated international law by its recent seizure of Manchuria and demanded dissolution of the League of Nations.

THE NATIONAL BUDGET To avoid confusion, let it be remembered that President Hoover is about to deliver not one but two messages to Congress, the second of which is the annual budget message, scheduled for Wednesday, with his message on the state of the union, is due Tuesday.

It is the budget message which perhaps is of more concern to the individual taxpayer, for this year it may be expected to strike pretty close to home, with the over-present necessity for balancing the federal budget, and the admitted extravagances in national governmental costs.

It will be interesting to see just how far Mr. Hoover will go in this regard. Certainly he will have no hesitancy in going the limit, for he has nothing to lose politically—not any more. Were he just about to enter upon four more years of administration, he might trim his sails differently, but now with a desire to leave the national treasury to his successor in the best shape possible, there should be no surprise if he urges upon Congress more stringent economies, and increased taxes designed to swiftly accomplish the most necessary task of putting the U. S. on its own financial feet.

Logically he will suggest increased income taxes, especially in the lower brackets, but actually the Hoover mind rebel against this. What is more likely to be proposed is increased taxes on consumers, in the form of a sales tax, extracted either from retailers or wholesalers, but in the end to be borne by the consumers.

There is no denying the necessity for drastic action on the part of the federal government in adopting a fiscal policy which will put a stop to a mounting deficit. But there are at least a couple of things to be kept in mind. One is the failure of the administration to have become sufficiently exercised over the matter a long time ago; another is that now is a most inappropriate time to commence levying and collecting increased taxes to pay for the excesses indulged in during prosperous years.

For the satisfaction which would come to Mr. Hoover in turning over "balanced books" that should not be placed on the shoulders of the American people, exorbitant and new taxes, unless it be in the form of income taxes from those able to pay. All will agree that excesses should be cut as nearly as possible to equal the income, and no new deficits created, but the one we already have was equally offensive two years ago and its elimination must be gradual and accomplished with high discretion. This it seems, will be one of the big problems of the new administration. Because it is no easy task, those who solve it wisely will have the grateful appreciation of a people who will always feel that the unbalanced budget was an unnecessary creation of the administration, which fact was demonstrated in the repudiation administered at the polls last month. The budget message should be watched for carefully by every citizen. It will be a highly important document.

WHAT MARVELS WE MORTALS BE! It is a fascinating picture of the human body which Dr. George W. Crile of the Cleveland Clinic has drawn up.

An almost infinite number of tiny suns, intensely hot and glowing like distant star-points, forming minute solar systems "created in its own image by the sun's radiance"—this is the set-up in our bodies as Dr. Crile sees it.

"We may say that the protoplasm is a 'milky way,'" he remarks, and again he refers to the vital centers in the system as "sun in infinite miniature." All of this, whatever else it may mean to research workers, seems to prove nothing so much as that when you extend science and poetry far enough they meet, like parallel lines pulled out to infinity. This work, that Dr. Crile has been doing is a matter of laborious, shrewd and mathematical calculations—seemingly so—and it may be a business as could be imagined.

But his conclusion, however, it may rank as science, is the very stuff of which poetry is made. The high sense of wonder, of great marvels, of profound and breath-taking mystery which the artist finds when he looks into the riddle of human existence is expressed here just as an artist might express it. Beneath the palm of your hand or the skin on your shoulder there lies a glowing, incandescent illumination of the wheeling sun and the golden stars. You cannot see it, you cannot detect it by any combination of microscope and dissecting scalpel—but it is there, as amazingly tiny microcosm, existing alike normally and criminal, in old-man and newborn baby.

That is Dr. Crile's picture. It comes out of a modern laboratory, which is modern scientific materialism incarnate, but it is a picture that only a great artist could have conceived or expressed.
