Sub-Zero Weather of Season Follows Light Snow in Twin Falls

Twin Falls and other central Idaho cities today were hit by a cold snap which followed a heavy snowfall in the morning. The mercury fell to a low of 23 below zero at Twin Falls when it touched the tenth of a degree below zero at 8 a. m., according to the observations at the bureau of entomology. It was colder here than at any time earlier in the season.

An east wind Thursday morning added to the intensity of the cold which followed a heavy snowfall the day before and the first snow of any consequence in the season. However, the snow flakes were practically all deposited by night.

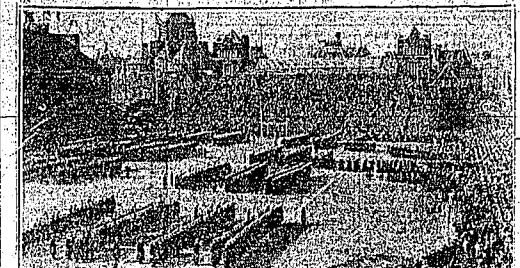

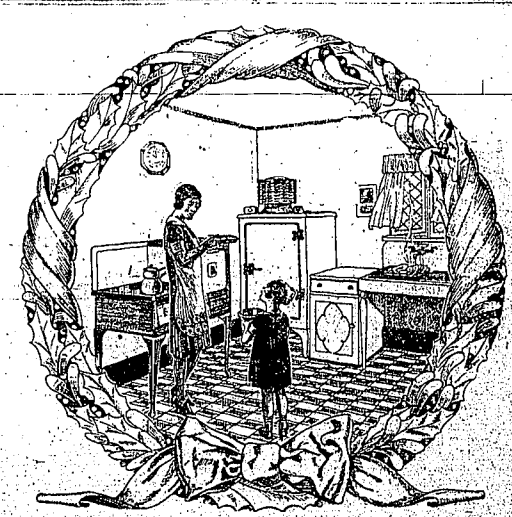

HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETICS

One of the most intelligent criticisms of high school athletic programs yet offered was voiced recently by Carl A. Jessen, education specialist in the Department of the Interior, in a speech at Atlantic City.

Mr. Jessen pointed out that the evil of "overemphasis" in scholastic athletics is chiefly the fact that huge sums of money are spent to provide athletic recreation for a comparatively few pupils.
