ROBERT DWIGHT LEEPER

In the death of Judge Robert Dwight Leeper at Boise Monday, Idaho is bereft of one whom the state could ill afford to lose.

Former commander of the Idaho department, American Legion, brilliant northern Idaho attorney, youngest member ever to sit on the state supreme court, he had in his 41 years gone far in his profession and demonstrated the uncommon ability he possessed.

News of his untimely passing came as a shock to all Idaho, for he was cut down in the prime of his young manhood, following not quite a full year's service on the supreme bench where he had added much to his reputation in jurisprudence.

Admittedly, Justice Leeper was one of the outstanding characters of the state and his death from pneumonia robs the commonwealth of one of its rising characters. As a prominent Legionnaire, he had wide acquaintance among ex-service men, who had given him the highest honor within their power.

As was the case two years ago when tragic accident cut short the youthful and brilliant career of James Harris of Weiser, another ex-commander of the state department of the American Legion, and one who had just been elected district judge in the western part of the state, the death of Judge Leeper is particularly deplored.

His family and his friends may take comfort in the knowledge that he bore an enviable reputation throughout the state and that his achievements were worthy of high emulation. He was a gallant soldier, and energetic and faithful Legionnaire, a brilliant attorney and a profound jurist.

All Idaho is the loser in the passing of such notable young men, for this generation needs their kind.

THE PROBLEMS FOR THE DEMOCRATS

The last presidential campaign was in some ways very educational.

During the course of it Americans generally were persuaded that it makes very little difference, as far as business prosperity is concerned, whether we have a Republican or Democratic administration in Washington.

They gave up the hoary myth that one party is sure to keep business booming and that the other is pretty apt to drop a monkey wrench in the machinery.

Learning that the economic cycle operates more or less independently of governments was the beginning of wisdom. But just as we got that lesson down pat, along comes Col. Leonard P. Ayres, famous business statistician, to declare bluntly that whether prosperity comes back in the near future depends largely on what the new administration does during its first few months.

Yet this needn't be as confusing as it sounds.

This depression, Colonel Ayres explains, is unlike all previous ones. Our economic difficulties, for the first time, will not be self-curing. Hitherto a steadily increasing population, a constantly expanding export trade and the steady rise of great new industries have made the eventual return of prosperity automatic. Now, for the first time, all three of these factors are absent. If we are to recover, it must be through definite government action.

In that fact lies both hope and danger.

If a wise settlement of the war debts and a sane re-adjustment of tariff laws can rehabilitate our export trade, if the soundness of our money can be preserved by proper fiscal policies at Washington, if the government can find some way of adjusting the relationship between low commodity prices and a domestic debt structure which is based on pre-depression prices—if all of these things can be done, says Colonel Ayres, the foundations for a genuine recovery will have been laid, and the rest will be just a matter of time.

But there is another side to it. If these things are not done; if the debt-and-tariff muddle remains in its present chaotic condition, if the budget stays off balance—if we resort to inflation as a stimulant for business—in that case we may find that our hard times have only begun.
