Local Memorial Foundation  
Conducts Public Meeting  
Honoring Thursday

**REED SMOOT'S SUCCESSOR  
EULOGIZES EX-PRESIDENT**

Lists Contributions of Ameri-  
ca's War-time Leader  
Internationally

The life and works of Woodrow Wilson, America's greatest statesman, were eulogized in an address here Thursday evening by Dr. Elbert D. Thomas, Salt Lake City, who spoke under auspices of the Wilson Memorial Foundation at Lehi.

Dr. Thomas, who is a professor in the University of Utah, will speak at several other cities in the West next week, accompanied here by Mrs. Thomas, both of whom were enroute here to attend the principal anniversary at a Wilson banquet in Boise Wednesday night.

They were met at Shoshone and brought here by auto by Asger H. Wilson. The visitors returned to their hotel after the meeting, the night in Twin Falls.

"Mrs. James D. Whelan, president of the foundation, presided at the meeting, which was opened by a reading of the Wilson selections. Mrs. D. E. Reed accompanied both and addressed the audience.

Another speaker, former national constituent and now chairman of the congressional district campaign committee, described the Wilson meeting as "the most important in the forty-fifth anniversary of the birth of the distinguished war-president."

Dr. Thomas' words of tribute rendered a unanimous ovation.

### BUILDING BURNS AT CASTLEFORD

#### Seven Lives Are Imperiled When Hotel Structure Goes up in Smoke

CASTLEFORD (Special) — The lives of seven persons, including the proprietor of the Castleford hotel and pool hall, may offer new hotel guests a safe haven from the uncertainty of destroyed buildings—all of undetermined origin completely destroyed building—and all destroyed at 1:30 o'clock Friday morning.

Total damage was placed at \$10,000. The building was insured for \$10,000 by the nation's financial and industrial leaders following.

## Accident Victims Seek Recovery of \$10,925 in Damages

Suit for collection of damages in the total amount of \$10,925 is sought by the family of Mrs. Frank Wilson against Otto Luthe.

The accident, said to have taken place on Highway 35 southwest of Rogerson on Oct. 2, when the truck driven by Otto Luthe, was struck by a coupe allegedly driven by Luther on the highway of speed estimated by the plaintiff at 66 miles an hour.

The accident, which took place in the collision zone, the complainant states, Mrs. Ada L. Wilson was thrown from her seat, sustaining a fractured vertebra, a partially prolapsed bowel the wrist and a broken arm.

On the same date, ten hospital visitors and a doctor received \$175 for medical and hospital bills;

**HURRAHS FOR THE FUGITIVE**

The sympathy which so many people extended to Robert Elliott Burns, the Georgia prison fugitive when New Jersey's governor refused to send back to Georgia, undoubtedly was due not so much to the man's story of injustice and brutality as to the aged impulse to extend good wishes to any man who is fleeing from the law.

That impulse dates away back in the history of civilization. Automatically, without inquiring into the justice or otherwise of the case we have a queer fellow-feeling for any one who is running away from restraint. We have a sneaking hope that he gets clear away, and we don't often bother to find out whether he is fit to be at large.

Burns had got away, made a useful citizen of himself, been recaptured, escaped again and established himself once more. That a great many people were glad when Governor Moore refused to send him back does not necessarily mean that the nation as a whole is aroused about the condition of Georgia's penal system.

**A NEW FRONTIER**

Nobody knows how much land has been taken back by the states for taxes from its former owners. But some indication may be had from the fact that South Dakota recently sent more than 5,000,000 acres under the auctioneer's hammer. It is estimated that 20 per cent. of the state's total agricultural acreage will be removed from the tax lists when the counties take title.

There's a problem for you! We have grown accustomed to the thought that public lands were exhausted. Are we to have great areas of public lands again? If so, what are we going to do with them? A way must be found to convert this new factor into the unemployment situation. Can the states re-sell this land on long-time payments and easy terms to workers forced out of city jobs by the rise of machinery? Can they perhaps form themselves? Here is a chance for some pioneering in state legislatures this winter.

One steamship line receives \$87,820 from Uncle Sam for carrying 133 pounds of mail and another gets \$868,022 for carrying 133 pounds, says a congressman. That ought to be cheering news to the mailman whose back's still aching from the Christmas rush.
