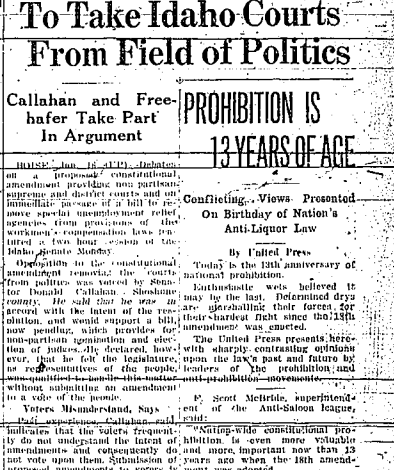

OUR DUNDLING RESOURCES

While the man in the street is trying to figure out just where the machine-age is leading him, scientists are quietly remarking that the age of machinery is apt to come to an abrupt end in the not-distant future because of the complete exhaustion of those natural resources which make a machine age possible.

Prof. Ross A. Gortner, University of Minnesota biochemist, has prepared a set of estimates about these things that have an ominous and chilling sound.

The world's stocks of coal and oil, without which the abundant energy of the machine age cannot be obtained, will be gone, forever, inside of 10 centuries, says Professor Gortner. The world's iron will be used up in 250 years. Copper, zinc, lead and tin will be gone long before the iron is gone.

Indeed, these time estimates are probably more liberal than they should be. They are based on the rate at which the world is now consuming the commodities in question; but in many cases the rate is constantly increasing, so that the bottom of the barrel may be reached, not in centuries, but it decades.

And then what happens? What becomes of a world which is tied together with bands of steel and copper and kept running with coal and oil, when the steel and copper and coal and oil are gone and there is no chance of digging up a new supply? What happens to its railroads and steamships and telephone lines and electric light plants and factories and automobiles and so on?

It makes a rather terrifying picture. We like to feel that we are at the dawning of a vast new epoch which will continue, in intricate mechanical process, for century upon century; it is like stepping off into the dark to reflect that this "new epoch" may only be a comparatively brief interlude in human history, followed, as it was preceded, by an age of stags, coaches, sailing ships, hand looms and pick and shovel labor.

A hundred years ago, yea a thousand years ago, man was bemoaning the fate of his posterity, and in vain. That is the weakness of Technocracy, which sees only the dire, the dreadful in this human scheme. But the world goes on and will continue to achieve, solving, mastering the elements.

The gloomy ones have always been here and always will. The present needs, and demands, developments, the constructive element of society, just as has been the case since time immemorial.

DEPRESSION-BLUE JACKETS

It is a new kind of unemployment relief which Admiral W. T. Cluverius, commandant of the Great Lakes-Naval Training Station, has suggested.

Admiral Cluverius urges that unemployed men be permitted to join the navy for four-month periods. The cost to the government he estimates at rather less than \$800 apiece; each man would be well fed and housed and would draw pay regularly; and the navy would benefit by creating a nucleus of partially trained men on whom it could draw in case of war.

In many ways the admiral's suggestion seems eminently sensible. The chief difficulty, probably, would be in persuading foreign powers that the move did not mean a sudden increase in our naval preparations.

It is quite possible, for instance, that Japan would plan to make war in the Pacific at an early date. If that point could be straightened out, the proposal looks like a good one.

NEWSPAPER CENSORSHIP

The mayor of Richmond, Va., not long ago decided that the Richmond newspapers had been criticizing him altogether too freely. So he announced that he would "sever relations" with them until they grew more friendly, and as a result obstacles were placed in the way of reporters who tried to get news about the operations of the Richmond city government.

"Nothing could have happened to put the duties of the press in a clearer light.

"It is one of the functions of a newspaper to criticize. If it is to keep faith with its readers, it must always be on the alert about the actions of public officials; for the general public has no other way to learn what its servants are doing. In a row of this kind, it is fairly safe to assume that the official concerned is trying to conceal something that should not, in the public interest, be hidden.

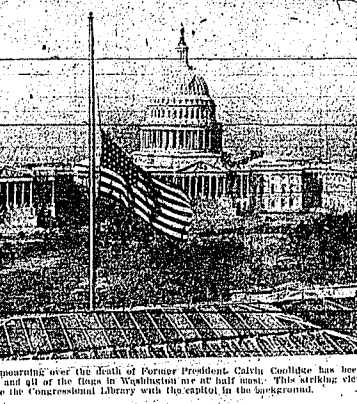
