WORLD POWERS WANT JAPAN TO HALT CONQUEST

WASHINGTON, Jan. 17 (UP)—The Senate today overrode President Hoover's veto and enacted a law giving independence to the Philippine Islands after 10 years under a transitional commonwealth government.

The vote was 64 to 26.

The bill comprises, conflicting claims with respect to political status, trade relations and immigration, along lines favored in a committee by both Democrats and Republicans. It is introduced by the president as a potentially disastrous to the Philippine Islands and conducive to Oriental domination.
