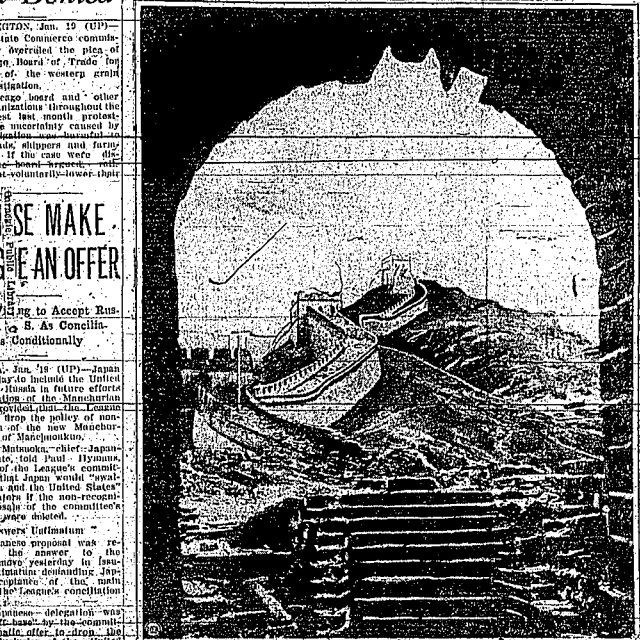

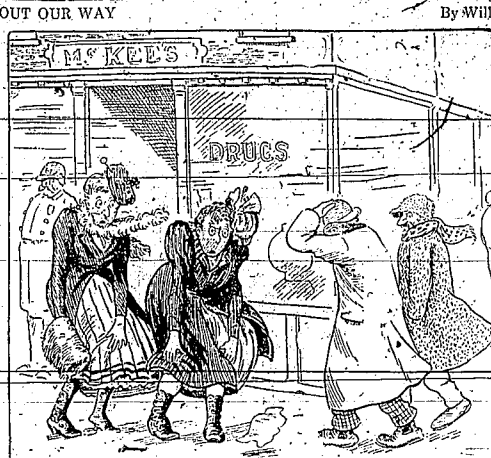

What, now, becomes of that time-honored chant about keeping the government out of business? When Uncle Sam guarantees the industry of the whole nation against loss, and starts to pocket a percentage of any profits industry may make, he is in business up to his neck, any way you look at it.

And yet, for all the criticism that can be raised against the plan, it is encouraging to see it put forward. At the very worst it is at least a positive, definite scheme for coping with an intolerable situation; and, as such, it comes close to being a complete novelty.

Perhaps the oddest thing about the whole depression has been the fact that responsible, comprehensive government and industry have been making a comprehensive program for solving things right. Such proposals as have been made have been sketchy and incomplete. We have been urged to tackle the problems of the depression separately; almost every scheme suggested has suffered because its author seemed to be afraid of going too far and startling someone a little.

Here, at any rate, is something concrete and far-reaching. It may be a good plan or it may be a terrifically bad one; but it is a plan, and it covers all of the ground. Even if it never gets beyond the blueprint stage it gives us a basis for discussion.

And it ought, for that very reason, to help us stop drifting. We ought to realize by this time that we cannot afford to sit back and wait for things to right themselves. If we don't like the R. F. C. plan, we cannot escape the necessity of trying to outline a better one.
