SINEMA-MAKES HIGHWAY REPORT

Twin Falls Road District Has 830 Miles of Traveled Thoroughfare

Simultaneous with the publication of the annual financial statement of Twin Falls Highway District for 1932, J. D. Stuart, district engineer, has made a comparative report on the condition and maintenance work for the past 12-month period.

It shows that of the 182 miles of state highway in the district there are 12.25 miles paved, 5.88 of one-grade and 4 miles of second-grade road, with 236.60 miles of gravel roads, 424 miles macadam and 614 miles gravel, 47.25 miles dirt and 830 miles traveled thoroughfare.

During 1932 4.53 miles of gravel road were constructed at a cost of \$919.17. 17.70 miles of gravel road, costing \$431 and including maintenance, were included in the cost of road maintenance work for the total for these purposes \$18,917.

There are now 582 permanent structures in the district, 405 of them being added during the year at a cost of \$238. The total cost of the permanent structures is \$13,331.
