COMMISSIONERS TO ACT

The league is planning to hold a public hearing on the subject of the highway bill, which is now before the legislature, according to a statement of John T. Hardin, secretary of the organization, at the meeting in the district court room Friday.

The meeting was made in response to a remark at the meeting that the proposed county recommendations would cost the county 32 per cent of the total tax levied.
