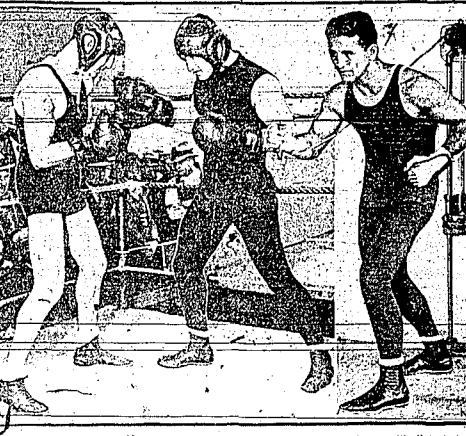

## COUNTY POOR FARM

The board of county commissioners have from time to time given serious consideration to the matter of a poor farm. Opposition has been expressed and arguments presented against such a move, but taking everything into consideration there is sufficient reason now for the plan to become a reality.

It is manifest that a suitable piece of land could be secured adjacent to the county, persons now receiving indigent relief could be cared for cheaper in a group than individually, the farm could be at least partly self-supporting for a quantity of produce could be grown and livestock raised, and many of these compelled to go to the farm could be employed and themselves be partly self-supporting.

Perhaps there would have to be additional investments in buildings, but these too could be erected cheaply, by making cabins similar to those in some tourist parks with only sanitary conveniences, or such buildings could be purchased cheaply and moved onto the premises.

This county, in the early days, used to pride itself on the fact that no poor farm was required; but the situation is different now, with the county compelled to aid many of the aged in quarters adjacent to the county hospital.

If the Old Age pension plan is abandoned here, undoubtedly there will be cases where the county will still have to support the indigent, and a poor farm is the logical solution of this problem as well as one which already exists with the Old Age pension provision in effect.

Economy is the only reason which prompts the suggestion for a county poor-farm. If it could not be inaugurated without the prospects for considerable savings then it would be folly to even give the matter consideration. But every reason appears to prevail to justify the belief that a poor-farm could be operated here at considerable saving to the taxpayers; just as they are being used as economy measures in several of the other counties in the state.
