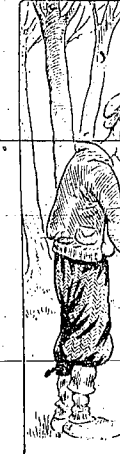

**THE CONVENING CONGRESS**

The American people are looking forward with expectancy to the assembling of the reorganized Congress, recognizing that its labors will be of transcending importance to the welfare of every individual.

It has long been an axiom that "prosperity cannot be legislated," but as the result of the experiences of the past few years, this belief has been thrown into the discard as recognition has been made of the harmful effects of unwise tariff legislation, and of the dependence upon law for protection in some regards, and insufficient governmental control in other respects.

We now sense that what has been done wrongly in the past can only be corrected by constructive legislation. It is with reluctance that any of us place much confidence in the personal benefits to be derived from legislation, but it must be admitted that emergency legislation is needed now—essentially to correct the financial situation; to aid agriculture, and to revive commerce.

A people bound round as we are with all kinds of laws, commissions, control, and other restraint; a people dependent upon the government to supply relief funds; and who look to the same source for crop and feed loans, as well as other benefactions without end, cannot any longer maintain they are not under obligation to Congress for relief legislation.

In many regards it is these man-made restrictions which have brought on the present emergency. The difficulties there, must be corrected also by the same forces which were responsible for them. And it must constantly be kept in the forefront that laws and legislation are the instruments of the people, not vice versa.

Too much must not be expected either of the executive or legislative branches of the government. There still remains the need for individual initiative and the necessity for everyone, every firm, every organization setting his or its own house in order. The government at Washington cannot do it all.

But the people are expecting Congress to live up to its highest tradition, to match the pace already set by the President of the United States, and do all in its power to afford relief, and that quickly. Above all, it must act wisely.

That is the hope of the American people today.

**HELPLESS CHINA**

Dispatches from rival commanders in the field seldom agree on what has actually taken place, and it is, consequently, difficult to know at this distance precisely what is going on on the battlefields along Jehol; but a summary of the conflicting claims seems to indicate that the Japanese drive is moving even faster than the Japanese themselves predicted, and that Chinese opposition is not sufficient to stem the march of the Mikado's efficient, disciplined war machine.

This, after all, is hardly surprising.
