BROWERS ACCEPT BEET CONTRACTS

Protest Made Against Inclusion of Tariff Clause This Year

Acceptance with reservations of the proposed 1933 contract for sugar beets was voted here late yesterday afternoon by the manufacturers' growers' board of the Idaho Beet Growers' Association.

The tariff clause inserted in this year's contract, was the bone of contention, the vote favoring acceptance of the contract but protesting inclusion of the tariff clause.

Burden on Grower This clause makes provision for additional deductions from the amount to be received by growers. In case the tariff on sugar lowered next year, results in decreased market. If the tariff is raised for any other reason, the clause will be ineffective. It was explained by George P. Smith, secretary and president of the state association.

Members of the Beet Growers' Association met at the Agricultural Sugar company spoke to the growers, explaining the manufacturer's reasons for insisting on inclusion of the tariff clause. The speaker stated there is a large acreage of sugar beets in this territory, pointing out that the beet growers are expected to care for the product of 15,000 acres next year, whereas only about 10,000 acres were planted in this territory.

Representative of the Beet Growers' Association, D. E. Koenig, a vice president of the directors of the Beet Growers' Association, is protesting against the inclusion of the tariff clause. Mr. Koenig stated that the Beet Growers' Association directors is to be held soon in order to take action on the contract. The Beet Growers' Association is being organized and this week in regard to it also.

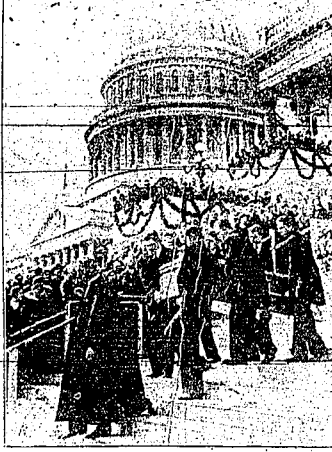
Dies at Home of Son Near Piler

A vote on the proposition was inconclusive, only 15 districts voting in favor of these being favorable and two opposed.

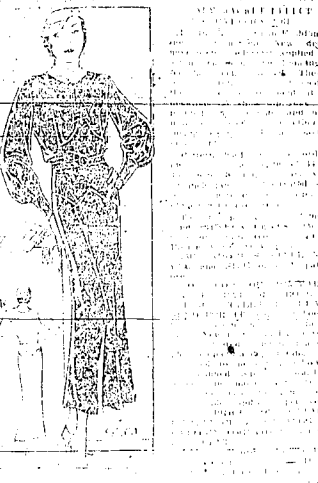
First District Meet Will Be Held in May

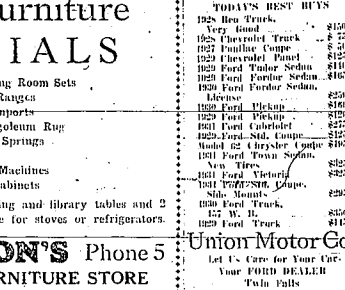
