Beverage May Be on Sale Inside of 20 Days If Senate Acts Speedily

WASHINGTON, March 14 (AP)—Legislation of 32 1/2 per cent beer tax was approved today by the House, following the passage of the House of Representatives. The vote was 216 to 177.

The chamber passed the Cullen-Hull bill and on it on friendly Senate. Legislation followed, spurred by President Roosevelt's message asking immediate consideration of the bill.

Salient features of the Roosevelt program to reduce veterans' benefits include the following: 1—Eliminates compensation to veterans of all wars since the Civil war whose disabilities were not incurred in the service.

2—Empowers the president to fix the dates of beginning and end of hostilities for purposes of compensation. 3—Gives the president authority to fix rules governing degree of disability necessary for compensation.

4—Limits hospital care for non-service connected cases to those permanently injured. 5—Limits emergency retired officers' compensation to those who were injured prior to Nov. 11, 1918.

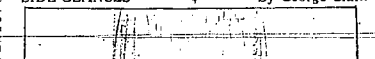

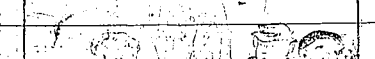

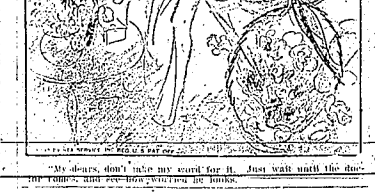
