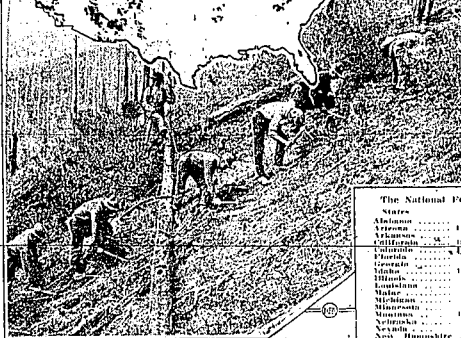

MAN AND MONEY... It is hard to contemplate how this and every other community would have gotten along this past winter without the assistance of the relief funds supplied through the offices of the various governors from the Reconstruction Finance Corporation.

In this community alone perhaps \$25,000 have been received and expended from this source, every cent of which has been paid out in money given to unemployed who have been given sufficient work each week to provide the necessities of life for themselves and their families.

The whole setup was a broad step in government social service, unprecedented, and warranted only by the exigencies of the stress which attended the economic situation during the fourth winter of the depression.

One of the remarkable features of the whole procedure is the swiftness with which these funds found their way into the localities where they were needed to relieve acute distress, and how the great responsibility of dispensing these sums was readily shouldered by the respective governors' offices and by the relief organizations in the various communities of the United States.

Locally the remedy has been applied to some 500 cases, virtually dependent upon a generous government for means of subsistence. The Associated Charities organization has functioned comparatively smoothly through the volunteer assistance of scores of noble men and women who, with war-time vigor, applied themselves to the task at hand and met the situation regardless of handicap.

Now that the weather has moderated and with the feeling prevailing that the rigors of winter are past, there will gradually be a lessening of the demands, and men will find their way into private channels of employment on farms, in industries and in other localities.

The crisis is believed to be past, with perhaps another month of work-relief in prospect to those in need.

Through all this huge relief project locally there has been seen the guiding hands of E. J. Finch, Associated Charities head and Captain C. H. Kregel, Red Cross Chapter chairman.

Finch worked this time as he did during the war in his capacity of county auditor and recorder, when he was unexpectedly called upon to head the draft work-details here; he conceived the Rock Creek parkway improvement project and this year as well as last bore the brunt of the charity work here, as he continues to do.

Captain Kregel, with a zeal no less fervent, has given his time and talents in winning this war locally, just as he did in France, and he is as much as ever the man who leads and his colleagues in the work; but if Twin Falls were voting on the men who have done the most for their community during the past year, it would not be hard to determine who are deserving of the honors.

The pride they and their associates must have in the achievement is but a measure of the satisfaction which must come to every man and woman, everywhere, in the knowledge that they have made some contribution to the welfare of society and performed heroic tasks when there were necessary jobs to be done.

Thus will the past winter be long remembered; for the part men and money have performed in maintaining the morale of the community and leaving a record for which the people as a whole should have everlasting appreciation.
