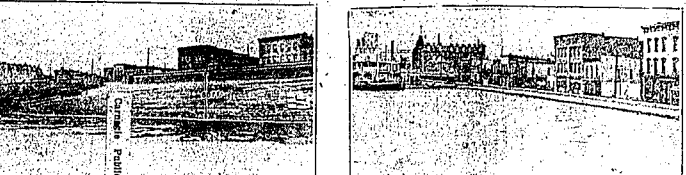

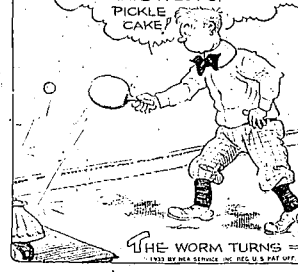

The memory of a good man is being blasphemed by the idiotic rumors that Senator Walsh did not die naturally, but was poisoned. Actually his relatives had no such suspicions.

Other rumors concern rich men (Mellon and Mills) who are supposed to have shipped large sums out of the country before the recent bank crisis. They are absurd on their face.

What other country would you care to trust your money in right now?

MOMENTOUS MARCH

The end of one of the eventful months of American history approaches.

There is little need to review here the occurrences which commenced almost with the start of March; but suffice it to say there are few of this generation who will soon forget the whirlwind financial function which was coupled with it in quick succession the death of Walsh, and of Cernak after the attempt on the life of the president-elect, followed by the electrocution of the assassin; the proclamation for a bank holiday, after every financial institution in the country had been closed; then with machine-like rapidity the summoning of Congress, the passage of the banking bill, the budget bill and the beer bill, spelling for the present at least the doom of prohibition as it has for so long been known. And the legislative barrage continues, with unemployment and farm bills now under consideration, while thrown in for good measure this month have been such occurrences as the disastrous southern California earthquake, and prospects of a European war.

PRESIDENT IS NOT A DICTATOR

Just why anybody should fear that Congress, by granting President Roosevelt extraordinary powers, is turning him into a dictator, is a thing very hard to figure out.

It is perfectly true that the powers already given Mr. Roosevelt, together with those proposed for him but not yet definitely granted, are far greater than any powers ever before given to a peace-time president.

It is perfectly true that executive authority centered in the White House today is greater than that wielded by any other presidents, with the possible exception of Lincoln and Wilson.

But does this make him a dictator? And if you say that word in its ordinary meaning. Not if such men as Mussolini, Hitler, Stalin and Kemal Pasha are dictators.

A dictator, to begin with, is almost always a "man on horseback." Behind him, whether he is actually a military man or not, can be heard the clanking accoutrements of an army. His power, in the last analysis, rests on force. At the first threat to his program, at the first attempt to reduce his power, he puts this force to work—ruthlessly and decisively. The bayonet, rather than the ballot, is his ultimate supporter.

Does any of this apply in even the remotest way to President Roosevelt? Is his power even slightly dependent on the troops at the army posts about Washington, or on the washings that anchor occasionally in the Potomac?

Those questions are so absurd that merely by asking them we see how unlike a dictatorship the presidency of Mr. Roosevelt really is.

What is actually lacking here is not a denial of true democracy but a substitution of it. An effort is being made in Washington to make leadership effective, to be done with petty delays and a multitude of conflicting commissions. We, the people, put Mr. Roosevelt where he is; we can put him out again if we choose. Congress can checkmate him if it wishes. His power is a loan, and the loan can be called if it seems advisable.

Democracy today is in a crisis, and to get out of it it has to give its chosen leader extraordinary powers. But to say that democracy has abdicated its functions and given place to a dictatorship is simply absurd.

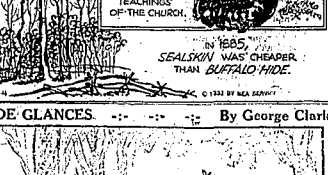
