NEW YORK, March 28 (AP)—One hundred and fifty-nine rookies are straggling their way to the major league training grounds, each hoping to convince a club manager that he is worth the trouble for him to crash into the big time.

With each club, one of those rookies already has distinguished himself as the star of the week-end camp, and the manager's list of the 15 teams today revealed that the 17 rookies of the champions of 1932 comprise 10 pitchers, four outfielders and three infielders.

Walker Looks Good Big Fred Walker, at 22, gives promise of being a greater major league player than was his father, Duke Walker, who pitched for Washington in 1912. Fast, hard-hitting and always trying, he's making a brilliant bid for a wide try to past. He played with Newark last season.

Tom Brannan was the outstanding pitcher of the international league last year with Newark. Brannan, during the season, and his record have virtually clinched a return.
