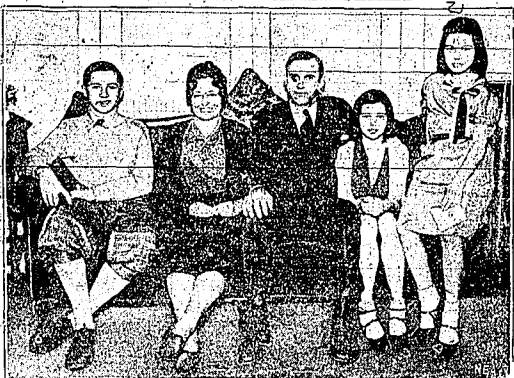
And while casting out of the window all faith which caused speculation of yearlings gone between the Cubs and the Holywood team, President Veeck arrived at other important decisions.

State Increases Size Of Game Licenses and Makes Other Changes

Officials of the State Fish and Game Commission today announced that the size of the Class I hunting and fishing licenses for 1933, have made several changes, one of which is designed to meet the objection of the part of sportsmen heretofore against the extremely small print of the 20-minute of the Idaho game laws appearing on the back of the license.

In order that this year's license could be printed in larger type, it has been necessary to make the license for 1933 considerably larger. Exclusive of the new changes which are retained for record, this year's license increases slightly or 11 inches in length and is approximately 6 1/2 inches wide. When folded, however, the license is only 9 1/2 inches by 5 1/2 inches.

The other change has to do with the deer, elk and moose and antelope permits which are attached to the license. Heretofore, these permits have been numbered and perforated, to be detached and fastened to the carcasses of killed game as a means of identification.

This year these permits are no longer numbered but are made detachable, instead a metal tag costing 41 cent is issued for deer, elk

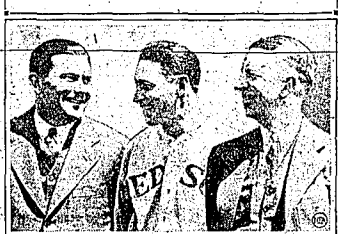

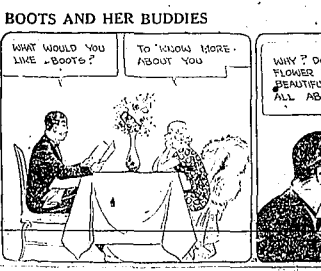
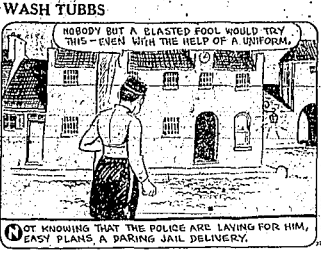
