# JOHN L. BRADY

In the death of John L. Brady of Blackfoot, Idaho newspaperman has lost one of its veteran journalists, who had many years to contribute for the benefit of his state.

Typical he was of that school of newspaper workers, who were skilled in the art through long years of grind on a variety of publications. He had founded several Kansas publications, and achieved distinction there in the legislature, being offered the nomination for governor, but declined only because of an overwhelming grief resulting from the death of an infant daughter.

He came west, being made editor of the Salem (Ore.) Statesman, and commenced his career in Idaho, not so long ago as newspapermen judge time, when he became identified with the Idaho State Journal at Pocatello. From there he went to Blackfoot where his influence has been potent.

He was the brother of one of Idaho's United States Senators, the late James H. Brady of Pocatello, a name which has long been identified with Idaho newspapers, the Brady-estate once having operated the Idaho Falls Post.

John Brady's death was unexpected. He died in a Pocatello hospital Sunday night following a week's illness from heart failure. Following funeral services in Blackfoot yesterday, the body was taken by his wife, Mrs. Lee Crittenden Brady, the well-known prohibition leader, to Salina, Kans., his former home, for burial.

His reward comes in his painstaking devotion to his calling and the influence for good he wielded in politics, civic affairs and morality.
