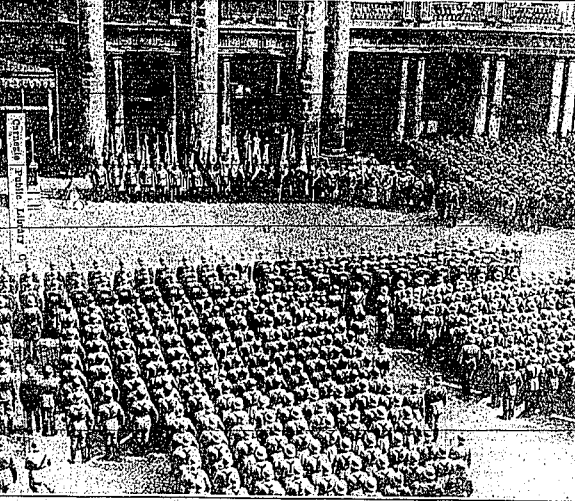

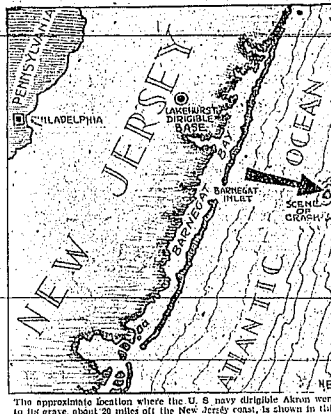

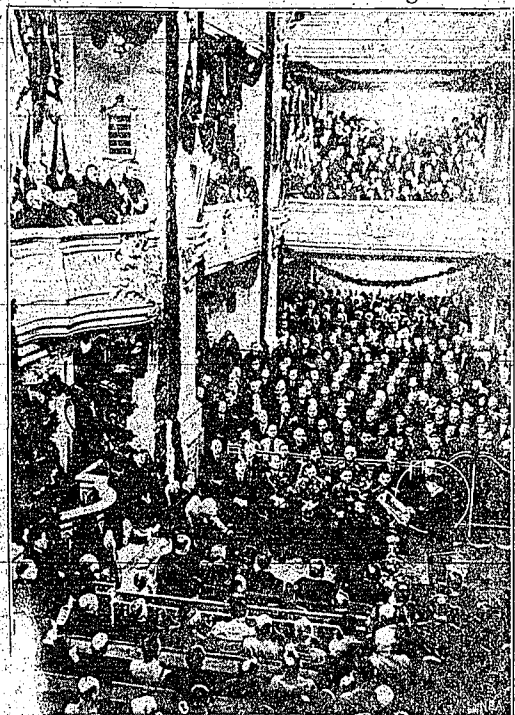

FRANCE TO PUSH ITS PROPAGANDA

Nation Provides Large Sum For Work, Especially In United States

PARIS, April 7 (UP)—An appropriation of 200,000 francs (about \$25,000) for the carrying on of France's propaganda campaign throughout the world, particularly in the United States, and the approval of the changes of procedure.

The appropriation, passed on Jan. 10, 1933, budgeted for the French office, provides for a general reorganization of the French propaganda service. The foreign office emphasized that the present means should be used, so far as possible, including American newspapers and certain news agencies rather than the United Press for the dissemination of information concerning official affairs.

Former Premier Edouard Herriot, referring to the propaganda appropriation, during debate in the foreign affairs budget, said it was necessary to ensure that exact information about France was sent abroad. He approved the establishment of a new government information service.

LARGE HOARDERS ARE THREATENED

Government Makes Determined Move to Gather Rest of The Yellow Metal

WASHINGTON, April 7 (AP).—Complete domination of the country's banking and currency system with a view toward curbing widespread hoarding and protection against stock in belief that the purchase of the additional quantity's latest issue will "corner" gold.

Already controlling more than three-quarters of the country's \$2,250,000,000 gold, the government is threatening hoarders with fines and imprisonment in an attempt to gather the much of the remainder, estimated at \$1,000,000,000.

Hoarder's Standing Maladjusted.—Through this means, the country's monetary gold reserves will be preserved as a basis of currency backing for a common gold. The integrity of the American dollar will be maintained for a longer time, and the government will be prevented from hoarding money by the "buying-out" of gold, and the government will split further control over the banking system.

The \$1,000,000,000 in gold already outstanding and under the control of the government, through the treasury or the Federal Reserve board, represents the assets of citizens of money in circulation. Much of it has been sent to Europe in the form of gold and rests in hoards of many foreign individuals.

By persuasion, the government has induced the public and banks to return \$200,000,000 of currency during the week ending March 20, 1933, and in the next few days, it is expected to strengthen currency.

The government expects to promote foreign trade as much as possible without depriving the country's gold reserves. In cases where gold is necessary to promote foreign trade, the secretary of the treasury will have the authority.
