FRANCE REPLIES TO MUSSOLINI'S PEACE PROPOSAL

Ambassador De Jouvenel Personally Hands Document To France's Premier

MAY REVIVE TREATIES

II Due Favors Four Power Alliance to Preserve European Harmony

ROME, April 11 (UPI)—Henry De Jouvenel, French ambassador, delivered, yesterday, to the Italian大使館 today, his government's reply to the Italian proposal for a four-power treaty to preserve the peace.

The reply gained added significance because it came at a time when the French were awaiting a new conference on proposals for an accord between Fascist Germany and Italy. The Vichy government, last week, presented a solid front against communism.

Conference Planned

Henry Elizabeth Dauvillier, of Austria, who has been away since May, was to leave Vienna by plane today to join German Vice Chancellor Franz von Papen, Italian Foreign Minister, and Austrian Ambassador Hitler who is seeking an understanding with the Axis powers.

France rejected the plan he adopted and carried to power in Germany.

France rejected its reply to Mussolini's proposal to maintain the peace so important that it called De Jouvenel to Paris.

Proposed Project

Mussolini proposed an alliance with France, Italy, Great Britain and Germany to maintain world peace.

France accepted the readjustment of European boundaries which were radically changed close of the World War. Already Poland and the countries of the little Entente had accepted the new arrangement.

The rate of German and her allies have launched a vigorous campaign to maintain the peace.

DROUGHT BOOMS GRAIN PRICES IN MARKETS OF U. S.

Value of Stored Crops Increases Steadily in the Last Five Weeks

BINS CONTAIN MUCH CORN

Dust Storms and Frosts Affect Activities in Maj. or Centers

CHICAGO, April 11 (UPI)—The grain market of Chicago, which is more than \$100,000,000 in the last five weeks whether they did a lick of work or not, is still up.

Chicago grain, 10c, oats and barley in their ears and blanched, gained this much in price due to the boom in the market.

The reason for most of the price increase in the grain pits is the fact that there is a great deal less wheat in the southwestern winter wheat belt. Frost have bitten the crop and that stores have scarce feed.

Wheat Estimate Given

Consequently, the United States Department of Agriculture estimated a winter wheat crop of 60,000,000 bushels as April 1. This would make the smallest crop since 1929, when the average was less than the 10-year average of 65,000,000 bushels.

Another factor has been the expansion of wheat acreage.

Specifically, in Kansas, large portions of Texas, Oklahoma and sections of adjacent states have been converted to wheat.
