### CONGRESS SLOWS UP DECISIONS ON CHIEF'S PROGRAM

Legislators Showing Disinclination to Rush Administration Measures  
DELAY IRK LEADERSHIP

G. O. P. Newspapers Manifest Signs of Revolt—Industry Alarm

WASHINGTON, April 17 (UP)—The time is near when President Hoover may have to choose whether he is ready to roll up his sleeves and fight for the revolutionary program which he believes necessary to counter the depression.

For the first six weeks he has been the victim of a "policy" war with him. They spurred on his fast-moving program. But these days are numbered.

Leaders Predict

Over the weekend, Senate leaders disapproved the Hoover program bitterly over the increasing limitation of Congress. They are not only unwilling to pass emergency measures without consulting them, but they will be stepped on as beginning to pull the strings to the legislative dance of Congress.

Republican newspapers are showing their first signs of rebellion at the scrapping of the traditional party doctrine, which favors heavy private business. Industries which have managed behind high tariff walls are registering alarm over President Roosevelt's plan to ask Congress to abolish the tariff.

MacDonald, former President Hoover and other leaders of the conservative wing of the party are opposing the program.

Oppose Hoover's Program

President Hoover's program is being opposed by the Chamber of Commerce, a private power organization, the National Association of Manufacturers, and other groups registering strong protest against the Roosevelt program for development of public power.

Bankers have slowed down their power measures designed to make banks safe for depositors and to protect the public against speculative activities of banks and banks.

Stock exchange is protesting, contending to limit proposed federal regulation.

Real estate interests are apprehensive of plans to build cheap housing through government ownership of a vast public works program.

Business executives are faced with the probability of taking cuts in their \$100,000 salaries and the possibility of a reduction in management of the railroads through a federal administration.

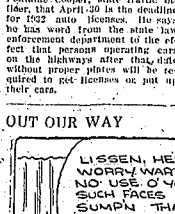

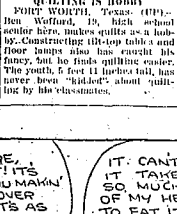

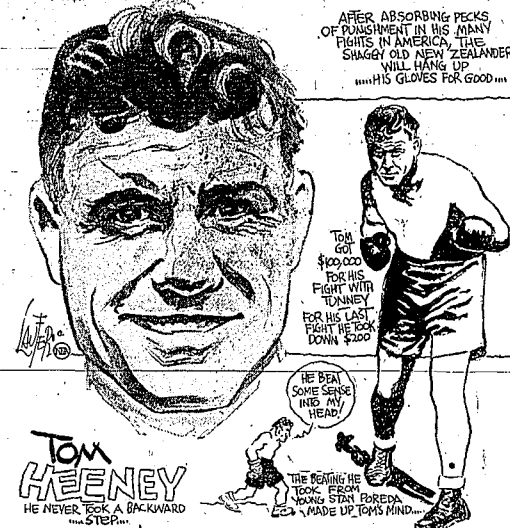

THE BUSINESS WHEEL TURNS

Merchants generally report that Saturday was one of the best business days of the year in Twin Falls, in some cases even exceeding that of a week previous, which day marked a new high for the season.

One automobile dealer reports sale of 18 stock automobiles since the middle of last month; another with sales equally as large says he is finding ready demand for all the machines he can secure from the manufacturer; while a third with a more expensive line has disposed of four new cars in the last few days.

Other business establishments also report a marked upturn in business, and it is to be noted that several new commercial enterprises are opening in Twin Falls.

All these things are highly significant, for they indicate a gradual return to normal times and normal conditions. They reveal increased confidence, a ready flow of money and an encouraging sign for everyone, revealing as it does a better condition among farmers, for business in such sections as this is inevitably a reflection of agriculture's condition.

This is not to say that agriculture has recovered, or that general business conditions can be said to be rosy. They are not. But the truest measure of returning normalcy is revival of those businesses including agriculture which for long have been dormant. Certainly in this community there is a changed attitude, a happier outlook.

The goal now is to keep conditions growing better, a feat to be accomplished by continued effort, a loosening of the purse strings, and revival of commerce in all lines.

The national administration at Washington appears to be doing more in getting the economic circle off dead center. We are the ones to keep it moving.

Manifestly that is being done right here in Twin Falls in the same proportion that the various other communities in the area are responding to the challenge.

ESTABLISHING A 30-HOUR WEEK

It is not so very long since one of the largest industrial concerns in the nation was arguing seriously that it could not operate profitably unless it maintained the 12-hour working day in all of its plants. Today a bill providing for a national 30-hour week for industry has passed the Senate. With certain modifications, it seems to stand an excellent chance of becoming law.

The gulf between the viewpoints represented by those two time-scales is almost unimaginably wide. One harks back to the era that built the pyramids, when a workman's value was expressed solely in the muscles of his back and arms and legs, and when the fate which might come to him as an individual was so utterly unimportant that it never even occurred to his bosses to think about it.

The other expresses the ideas of a new day; a day in which heavy machinery does the heavy work and the workman himself is, not simply a cog in an industrial mechanism but is, first and foremost, a citizen whose right to a good job and a decent living is paramount to all other considerations.

The speed at which we have traveled in the past decade can be gauged by that contrast.

Just how a federal law fixing a maximum working week might work out in practice is something else again. Such a law would have to be elastic, it would have to be administered with great wisdom, and it might well have to be accompanied by some sort of minimum wage law. But at the moment those matters are beside the point.

The really exciting thing is the fact that we are at last able to contemplate such a law without qualifying in our boots and muttering about Bolshevism. This scheme would have looked like the very quintessence of radicalism a few years ago; today we are about ready to accept it as a part of a whole new program, and so far it has drawn far less comment than the fact that an American citizen can legally buy a glass of beer.

That change reflects a shift in public sentiment which is almost too profound to be comprehended.
