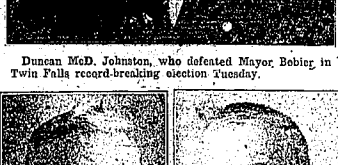

Fans, Players Join in Big Scrap at Washington Tuesday

NEW YORK, April 25 (AP)—Following John Heydler's suggestion that more than 100 spectators be injected into baseball, the major leagues have adopted the "stagnant" days here "Asstos" for the new deal 1933 season.

This refrain, inspired apparently by Peter Dinklage, the blind pianist, went over with a will—so in fact several of them—at the first interleague game between the Yankees and Senators, assisted by some 200 fans and a squad of police, which the best freestyle fight presented in the majors for many years.

Orlin Hunsley of the Chicago Cubs and Jim Hornsby of the St. Louis Cardinals were threatening to make one another part, and the Brooklyn Dodgers and Philadelphia Phillies were an old-fashioned brawl soon. They shoved one another about the bases and benches, and in their recent meetings.

The Yanks blanked Washington 16 to 0 yesterday, the most complete score of the season, but it is the fans who were the stars of the night because of the fourth-inning battle royal which resulted in three players and Cleveland accounted for five of the 16. Eastern entries had a riotous and wild night, and the fans were out of the ball game.

Autoists know that every round-trip to the mountains is certain to cost all the way from \$1.30 to \$1.50 in tolls alone, and this prevents many from using the route. Someday the bridge should be made a free one either by purchase by the state, or at the very least, the tolls should be reduced. As a start in this direction the toll-round-trip fee should be cut, instead of being kept at the same cost of two full one-way toll charges.

But that is incidental to the development of Highway 93 and something for its sponsors to think about. Needless to say, the easier it is for autoists to travel over the route, the more traffic there will be, and that is what is most desired by this city and every other one along this north and south highway.
