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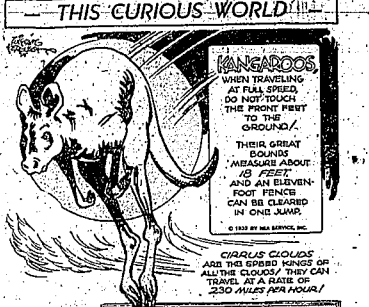

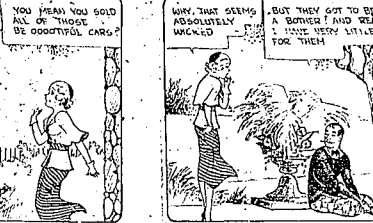

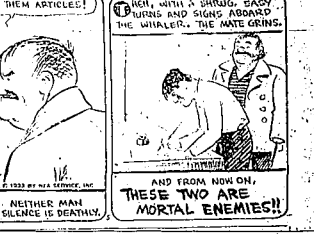

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REDSKINS HELD AS PARENT RACE OF MONGOLIANS

Robert Cites Similarity of Customs as Basis for Expressed Belief

BILLINGS, Mont. (UP)—North American Indians may have been the parent race of Mongolian tribes now wandering over Mongolia's vast Asiatic plain, according to a recent article by Dr. Thomas D. Marquis, authority on tribal customs.

Dr. Marquis pointed out that many customs and habits of the Indians resemble those of present-day Mongolians.

The Mongolian women must do most of the household and sewing work—was the opinion of Dr. Marquis.

Marquis has also noted a remarkable similarity between their habits.

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Many Biblical and early Greek references to eastern people and their habits show a striking similarity of Oriental custom with those of aboriginal Americans.

Mongolia topics, love of the blouse, horsemanship, and household habits are similar to those of the North American Indians, the author said.

IMPORTS MENAGE U. S. TUNA TRADE

LOS ANGELES—A flood of Japanese tuna will flow through Los Angeles harbor.

At least 500,000 cases of Japanese-packed tuna and thousands of tons of frozen fish are expected to be shipped into the harbor during the year.

Several American buyers departed for Japan recently on missions which will establish the U. S. tuna trade.

They include Charles P. Hall, vice president of the California Fish Corp., and M. Toki, Japanese representative of the exporters.

C. C. Kirtley, general manager of the Hall's concern, said that his firm alone would import this year approximately 300,000 cases of Japanese sashimi, or white meat tuna.

Other American brokerage firms, it is estimated, will import at least 200,000 cases this year.

Approximately 1,000 tons of frozen salmon, haddock and yellowfin tuna will be imported for packing here.

BERING SEA NOW BEING PATROLLED

WASHINGTON (UP)—The Bering Sea patrol, under the direct duty of the Coast Guard along the Aleutian coast, has begun today.

The patrol, conducted by seven Coast Guard vessels, has for its main purpose enforcement of international regulations relative to protection of seals, fisheries and fur-bearing animals.

The scope of the patrol, however, extends to various international functions, such as carrying out the mail, conducting scientific research, holding courts and language, settling differences between countries and nations.

The Bering Sea patrol, inaugurated the 10th year, leaving Seattle April 20. Other vessels in the patrol are the Squalodon, Talon, Clifton, Tallahassee and the patrol boat Alert.
