Bright pitching by both clubs thrilled the 35,000 fans who saw the New York Giants defeat the Pittsburgh Pirates.

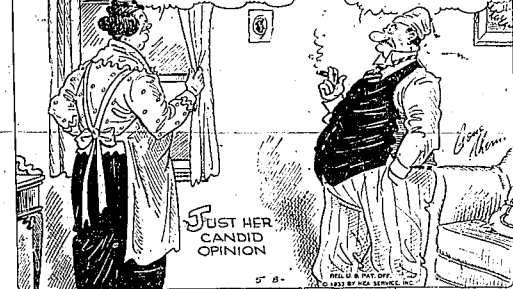
