# OUR LIBRARY

Not everyone in Twin Falls recognizes what a popular place the Twin Falls public library is.

A visit there most any time of day will reveal a large group of persons, studiously engaged in reading books, magazines, newspapers. During the hours when school children can visit the place the num-

ber of patrons is of course greatly argmented.

During the winter patronage was particularly heavy, and throughout the unemployment period

heavy, and throughout the unemployment periodity many, fine and women not, working, have not been enthely idle; they have been reading, learning, acquiring information which brought solace and help. The annual report of the librarian discloses that during the past year the library's circulation has to-tailed over 134,000, or a per capita of about 13 for the entire city.

The library here is different than many such institutions in that it is supported by the municipality; all taxpayers in the city providing the finds for its operation, with the exception of those which come from fines, rentals, and the books generously de-

operation, with the exception of those which come from fines, rentals, and the books generously denated by book-lovers.

Someday, perhaps, Twin Falls will have a public library building, donated by a philanthropist. Judged by the interest here in books as disclosed by the heavy patronage, nothing would be more worthwhile than a public library building and continued support and assistance to this worthy institution, too often forgotten by the general public.

## THE TEST CASE

THE TEST CASE

Intense interest attaches to the beer test cases now before the state supreme court. It is felt that upon the decision of that body much depends. Supposing, for instance, that the court should hold that near beer containing less than one-half of one per cent alcohol is being sold in violation of the present state law, as really has already been held, then it is reasonable to presume that liquior with even a trace of alcohol, is also legally intoxicating.

If on the other hand the court should hold that the beer in question (one-half of one per cent alcohol) is not intoxicating and not in violation of the state law, then certainly it will be up to the same tribunal to say just when beer, or other liquor, does become infoxicating—two per cent, three per cent, four, or even five per cent.

Doubtlessly the purpose of the lest case is to endeavor to induce the court to assume that the limit of alcohol prescribed by Congress is the correct per-centage, and to set 3.2 as the dividing figure.

The court, it is natural to believe will not wish to be rushed in approaching its decision, and of necessity will require time to weigh the arguments on both sides. So another month or two can be expected to clapse before the general public knows what the state's liquor status is.

It is all very interesting, not alone from the possibility of the decision being momentous, and being subject to much controversy, bit also because Governor Ross has taken the well-grounded stand that he will not interest himself in the question of calling a special session of the state legislature to plass on proposed beer or beer-tax legislation until after the supreme court rates.

While the subject is a delicate one from the standpoint of prohibition in Idaho, it is nevertheless a far-reaching one from several other standpoints, not excluding the intricate legal angle.


