

HOT WEATHER PRECAUTIONS

The general arrival of warm weather brings a new rush of business to the old swimming hole again; and this, very shortly, will bring the usan number of drownings unless the swimmers, juvenile and otherwise, pay attention to a few simple rules of

safety.

It isn't wise, for example, to go suddenly into cold water when you are overheated, or when you have just finished a meal.—It isn't wise to swim alone in spot where no one can help you if you need help. It isn't wise to dive into a strange pool without first satisfying yourself that you aren't apt to land on a hidden rock or snhg. It isn't wise to go in the water when you're under par physically, or to keep on swimming after you have got cold or tired.

Those rules are perfectly obvious, of course. But every year a lot of people who forget to heed them get, drowned.

Its increased use now, is evidence of the gradual return of presperity, and one of its most potent guarantees.


