DEPRESSION TRAGEDY

One of the suddest of all the stories of the depression is the one about the 14-year-old Indianapolis school girl who tried to end her life because her schoolmates taunted her when they found her wearing a shabby pair of shoes which one of their number had thrown away.

The girl was one of 12 children of a jobless miner.
The family had no money for shoes or anything else.
She had to wear the discarded shoes, which had been

She had to wear the discarded shoes, which had been found on some scrap heap, or go without.

It has often been remarked that the weight of the depression rests most, heavily on the children; and this pitful little story is a reminder that it is not only the physical deprivation which counts. The mental anguish inflicted on this youngster by the thought less, cruelty of her schoolmates is the sort of thing that is a long time healing.

SCIENCE DISCARDS 'CERTAINTIES'

A bright young man of today who set out to get a good grounding in the sciences could easily be for given for concluding that he was being asked to discard all of his certainties and substitute a somewhat jumbled moss of probabilities, near-probabilities and wild fuguesee

what jumbled mess of probabilities, near-probabilities and wild guesses.

A decade or two ago science was dogmatic and positive. It set up certain "natural laws" and they wore like the laws of the Medes and the Persians. Certain things were thus and so and no one need argue about it.

To appreciate how the picture has changed you need only consider a speech made in New York the other evening by Dr. Irving Langmuir, the 1932 Nobel Prize winner if chemistry.

During the last 20 years, he said, science has come to believe that "no natural hav has absolute validity" and that "in no absolute sense can anything ever be predicted accurately." The law of cause and effect is no longer with us, and nothing in the universe is securely hitched.

"Some things may be more probabile than others,"

securely hitched.

"Some liftings may be more probable than others," he added, "but you can't say that anything is absolutely true."

It would be hard to prerestimate the importance of this changed attitude, for it carries with it one of the profoundest revolutions that the human mind has ever been compelled to pass through. We are not become through with that revolution yet; indeed; we have hardly passed its first phase; and before we complete it some of our concepts of man and nature and life and the universe are likely to be altered almost

life and the universe are likely to be altered almost beyond recognition.

Nor is there anything in all-of this to depress the speculative soul who likes to feel that there are values which material standards cannôt assess and realties which human eyes cannot see. Indeed, the exact opposite is true. It is the ultra-materialist who is confounded by this change. How are you going to be dogmatic about the absolute dominion of material things when you cannot have one single certainty about them?

In its long climb up from darkness mankind has passed a great rise, and stands now facing limitless horizons. It has lost its old landmarks—but it has—anarvelous chance for adventurous exploration.


