delegations to withdraw their amendments.

The conference cannot continue indefinitely," he said. "What we do in the next few days may be decisive."

He appealed to the delegates for a final effort before the world economic conference.

"Arrangements create the very danger they are intended to avoid," he said. "I ask you to consider your own situation."

Accepting the MacDonald conference, Noyd said Germany did not really win the Munich decision, but as the base of a future economic pact.

"Still Want Equality"

"We receive application of the principle of Christian liberty," Noyd said. "Germany continues to demand disarmament of heavily-armed states, and equality of armaments."

Germany's "new attitude" will soon be put, Noyd said.

"Two new laws are proof of Germany's moderation," he continued. "We hope to see something like a contribution."

Then he glared at Heke Mays, who had just spoken.

Henderson had made a direct appeal to France in his speech. He characterized Hitler's speech as a national statement, "many a case" and "friendly appeal" to obtain arm equality before the armaments conference.

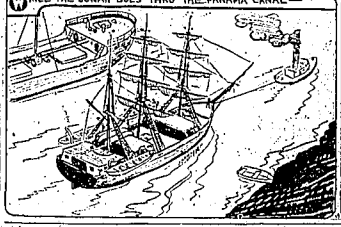

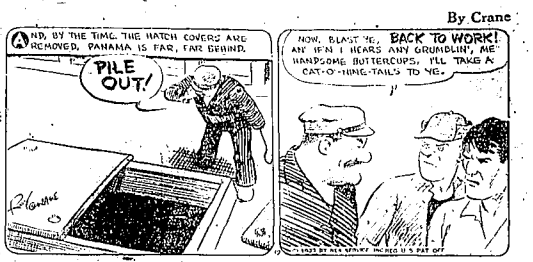
