CITY MAY SEEK \$160,000 FUND

Council Names Tentative Sum for Unemployment Relief Projects Here
In response to request of Workmen's Board that cities and other taxing units seeking public works funds, outlining their projects and make estimate of the probable sums required, Twin Falls city council last night gave its approval to the proposal of Mayor D. M. Johnston that \$150,000 be tentatively set aside as the amount required here.

With this sum it is proposed that \$110,000 be used for the construction of a "clear well" or water storage reservoir at the site of the municipal filtration plant south of the city. The other \$40,000 would be used for street improvements.

Details of the legislation which is expected to make available to the city from 15 to 20 million dollars for public works, are unknown at this time, particularly the proposed method of repayment of the bonds.
