## JURY ABSOLVES TOM MOONEY OF MURDER CHARGE

Judge Ward Orders Directed Verdict in Trial of Famed Lifer

**POLICE GUARD CHAMBER**

Acquittal Has No Effect on Life Imprisonment in San Quentin

SAN FRANCISCO, May 24 (AP)—Tom Mooney, convicted Treason and murder, was acquitted today when Superior Judge Louis H. Ward directed the jury to return a verdict of not guilty.

The verdict does not affect Mooney's life imprisonment sentence given in 1932 for the slaying of a police officer during the bombing of the San Francisco waterfront in 1916.

It merely provides him with a new argument on which to base his continued fight for a pardon. The trial jury lasted barely an hour on which to hear the evidence of the six men and six women who were selected by Judge Ward.

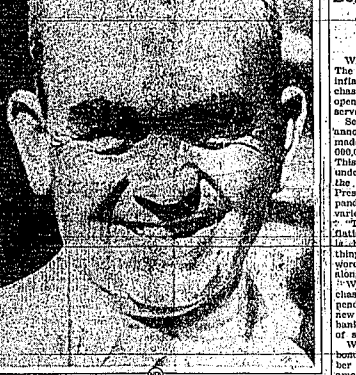
