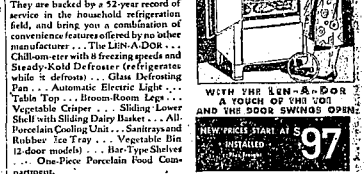

FIGHT TO STOP PRESS GAGGING

LONDON, May 25 (AP)—A determined fight to prevent any action tending to hamper the free flow of news throughout the world will be made at the Conference of the International Chamber of Commerce in Vienna next week.

The fight will be against a proposed resolution to be presented to the congress providing for "the freedom of press and the independent agencies for it is potentially dangerous to international freedom of the press and might be used, if adopted in its present form, to impede the free flow of news from our country to another, and possibly for the establishment of monopoly on official governmental news by official and semi-official press agencies."

In opposing the "Vienna resolution," the independent agencies insist on altering it by including the resolution adopted during the world press conference under the League of Nations at Geneva in 1927. It declared against restrictions or preferential treatment in access to transmission and publication of official governmental news.

The resolution was directed against the Honolulu Star-Bulletin which criticized President Roosevelt for asking assistance at present to a "small island" as governor of Hawaii.

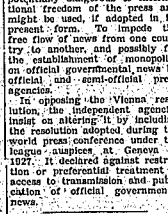

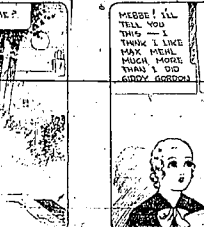

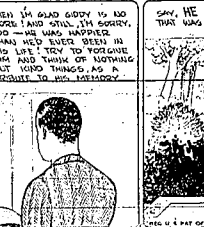
