SEGO FACTORY RE-OPENS

Reopening of the Sego milk condensary at Buhl following a two-year shut-down is another harbinger of an improved situation for the farmers of the county. Details of the plans were carried in an

Evening Times account Tuesday.

This large plant has been idle a long time, made so by the stringency which not orlly influenced the demand for milk, but also brought prices to a ruinous level, To-combat the problem the Sego Milk Products company, operators of the plant, simply shut it down and refused to attempt business during

shut it down and refused to attempt business during the crisis.

Its re-opening may be taken as assurance that the outlook has improved the future shows hope; and the prospects are better. New jobs will be provided, new incomes to dairymen are made available, new markets have been re-created.

As the Bull Herald says, "tile re-opening now speaks for a new deal for dairymen."

POPPY DAY

THE TRANSPORT PROBLEM

The question of how rail and highway transportation is to be worked out remains to be solved. Two recent supreme court decisions underline our need

recent supreme court decisions underline our need for a definite program.

In one case, the court held, in effect, that rail-roads can exterid their operations through the use of motor trucks without fetting the permission of the Interstate Commerce Commission. This ruling came down after several New York terminal companies had sued to enjoin the Pennsylvania railroad from using its own trucks for transferring goods in the New York area.

In the other case, a Texas law putting trucking companies under strict supervision of the state railroad commission was used. Texas sought to regulate the rates, hours of employment and methods of operation of all carriers using state highways; but the supreme court overruled the state's refusal to grant a permit to a trucking company in a test case.

These rulings only emphasize our need for a comprehensive program to deal with the whole question of rail and highway transportation.
