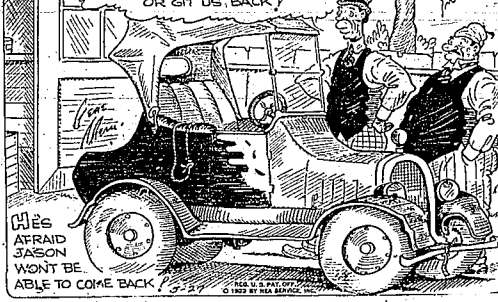

THE NEW GOLD STANDARD LEGISLATION

Clarification of the gold standard problem in the United States, as sought in the administration resolution presented to Congress is expected to go a long way in bringing the necessary business revival in this country.

Also, it is indicated in dispatches that the new legislation will be used as an inflationary substitute for the "gold content revision" clause of the Thomas currency amendment to the Farm act. This prior authorization would have permitted the president to reduce, by a maximum of 50 per cent the gold content of the dollar.

Opinion is general now that this new legislation will become an inflationary vehicle.

- Summarized, the resolution provides:
1. Holds that provisions for payment in gold or any particular kind of money obligations "are inconsistent with the declared policy of the Congress to maintain at all times the equal power of the dollar."
 2. Holds that such provisions "obstruct the power of Congress to regulate the value of the money of the United States."
 3. Proposes that Congress "declare against the public policy" any obligation "which purports to give the obligee a right to require payment in gold or any particular kind of coin or currency."
 4. Proposes that hereafter "every obligation shall be discharged upon payment, dollar for dollar in any coin or currency."
 5. Provides for repeal of any law which would prevent such manner of payments.
 6. Stipulates that all coins and currencies "heretofore or hereafter coined or issued shall be legal tender for all debts public and private, public charges, taxes duties and duties except that gold coins when below the standard weight provided by law "shall be tender only at valuation in proportion to their actual weight."

Passage of the measure is a foregone conclusion, thus adding one more powerful weapon in the administration's fight against the world-wide forces of depression.

FINANCIAL DOMINATION

Out of the mass of testimony in the Senate investigation is developing a clear picture of the mighty Morgan dynasty which reaches close to the throne of politics, finance and industry.

The story is being unfolded reluctantly by the House of Morgan itself.

United Press dispatches say that:

Patiently, a little at a time, the stocky Sicilian-born Lawyer Pecora is pulling aside the curtain which so long has shrouded the House of Morgan and made its affairs, figures of mystery.

From their own lips he has sought to show how their subtle power is spread, how, by favors to political and business friends, they build up a network of grateful recipients in big ways in American life, men some of whom were known to "Doc" Davis, as John J. Raskob put it in a letter accepting the Morgan offer to buy stock at bargain prices.

It is a dazzling list. Stock was offered below the market to men like Calvin Coolidge, Secretary of Treasury Woodin, Supreme Court Justice Owen Roberts and Senator William G. McAdoo. None held public office at the time. Charles Francis Adams, Hoover secretary of navy, bought his when he knew he was to go into the cabinet a few weeks afterward.

High figures in both political parties were on the list—Raskob, then chairman of the Democratic national committee, J. N. Mutt, treasurer of the Republican national committee, and a host of regional political overlords. Lawyers from John W. Davis, 1924 Democratic presidential candidate, now a Morgan attorney, and Newton D. Baker, Wilson secretary of war, on down the line were named.

Two national heroes, General John J. Pershing and Col. Charles A. Lindbergh, were there. Directors of dozens of nationally prominent business houses, banks, railroads and manufacturing corporations made the list a blue book of industry.

There is no intimation that favors were asked in return by the Morgans. They were befriending their friends, the men who had been a good terms with the past. Some were in a position to do a good turn in exchange. Others were in a position to scatter power, which is carried by the ability thus to scatter largesse wholesale is obvious to anyone who reads the testimony of the kindly faced, big, aging head of the Morgan House.

"His mild demeanor in the committee room, his hesitant stammer, are hard to fit into the picture of the 'money octopus' which committee counsel Pecora labored to draw," says Raymond Clapper United Press correspondent.

It will not be easy to curb the far-reaching influence which the Morgan House exerts through its domination of the financial world.

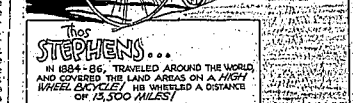
