REPEAL OF GOLD BASIS WINS IN TEST BALLOTING

Resolution Victory Precedes Final Approval, House Leaders Assert

IS AIMED AT HOARDING

Committee Sees Dramatic Fiscal Move Necessitated by Emergency

WASHINGTON, May 29 (AP)—An overwhelmingly influential House majority today carried the administration gold clause repeal resolution to victory on a vital vote...

The action, interpreted by Democratic leaders as virtually assuring final passage for dramatic new fiscal legislation, came on adoption of a special rule for consideration of the gold resolution...

The Fitcher-Stogdill resolution, which the historical 'gold clause' in contracts was designed to prevent, is the 'big ticket' bill...

The resolution, which would prevent, by statute, the registration of gold clauses in public obligations, is expected to pass the house tomorrow...

In the light of this situation, the report said, "two provisions, which have developed during the present emergency make the enforcement of the gold clause incompatible with the public interest."

Aimed at hoarding, the first was titled by the committee "Tendency to hoard gold"; the second, "the tendency for capital to leave the country."

Under these circumstances, the report continued, "no currency stabilization measure on gold or upon any other foundation, can meet the requirements of the emergency."
