The traveling man is more than just a part of a complex sales organization. He is a harbinger of busy times, an agent of good business; when he is on the road in force it is a safe bet that real prosperity is not far off.

It is interesting, therefore, to read the remarks made at Houston, Texas, recently by L. B. Carlon, national director of the Travelers' Protective Asso-

"You will soon see traveling men back on the road, the forerunners of better business and renewed commercial life," he said.

"In my round I find truly a feeling of optimism. Railroad car loadings are on the increase. Rail transportation companies are installing fast freights to handle the increased tonnage quickly. Men are go-ing back to work. Aggressiveness and enthusiasm have supplanted pessimism."

GUARANTEED BANK DEPOSITS






