You remember a year ago at this time it was partisan politics, with the national conventions in session at Chicago. That was the all-absorbing topic, and nothing else mattered much.

Then there was a wave of bank failures, and the economic situation was paramount in everyone's mind. Panic prevailed.

This was followed by the general election, which kept the people's mind and interest at a high pitch over the local, state and national contests.

And now we find the public surfeited in a maze of wet legislation, showing a great reaction over the situation of a few years ago.

Beer, repeal and kindred subjects are the topics of the day as legalization is secured by vote, by the calling of legislatures and the summoning of constitutional conventions.




