

The best way is to make all purchases possible at the lower levels, and thus reap the profit which otherwise might go into other hands.

None of us will ever know just how much we were influenced by a man whose death came last week. He was Cyrus K. Curtis, head of the great publishing firm of that name, whose magazines include the Saturday Evening Post, Country Gentlemen and Ladies Home Journal.

Happily, it can be said that for the most all these influences have been good, and have been constructive. This is not to say that they have always been right, nor that their policies have always met with universal gaceeptance, but there is ample indication that back of them was some personality, some influence which was always constructive, forward-looking and sound. That man was Cyrus K. Curtis, of whom few have heard very much; who was never blatant; and who always kept in the background.




