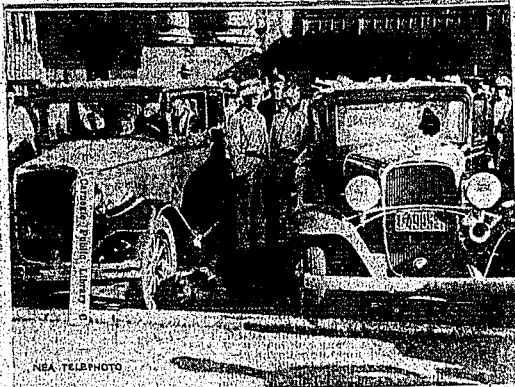

EDWARD DANIEL KINNEY The commercial life of Twin Falls has been robbed of one of its most vigorous personalities in the death of E. D. Kinney, public general services for whom are being held tomorrow.

AN EXPENSIVE BRIDGE

One more reason, in addition to those already listed by this newspaper, has been advanced against the continued maintenance of a toll bridge on highway No. 20.

Twin Falls city is informed this week that the amount of money it is to receive under provisions of the new federal works act is to be limited because appropriations cannot be made for highways leased directly to a toll bridge.

Reference is made specifically to the Twin Falls-Jerome inter-county bridge directly north of this city. It was built over five years ago and continues as a barrier to unimpeded traffic northward and southward.

The owners cannot be expected to give it up voluntarily, but certainly something will have to be done about the toll problem soon. As the situation now stands, the private corporation can continue collecting exorbitant fees in perpetuity. Nothing in the contract under which it was granted by the consent of the board of commissioners of Jerome and Twin Falls counties limits the length of time the toll shall remain in effect. Unless protest is made the charges can continue to be made indefinitely without any reduction from the present high rates.

There are several solutions. One is that the state highway department buy the bridge, and operate it the same as other such bridges in the state are operated. Perhaps some of the funds now being doled out to Idaho by the federal government could be so utilized.

But regardless of the feasibility of purchase, which is the best solution, the thing desirable and necessary is the reduction of the fees. Perhaps the Public Utilities commission of the state should be called upon to determine whether or not the charges are fair.

There is general dissatisfaction with the present method of operation which can only be stilled with a definite effort being made to reduce the charges and eventually vest the ownership in the public where it belongs.

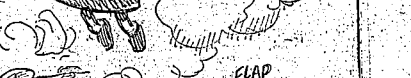
