



THE REPEAL QUESTION

Soon the beer problem will be out of the way, it is to be hoped, and then this state can devote the next three months to the election having to do with the constitutional convention for repeal of the Eighteenth amendment

For the reason that such an event will be new to many voters a few explanations are in order.

Governor Ross in his proclamation fixing the date of election for September 19, automatically set in motion the entire election machinery. Twenty-eight days after the election the chosen delegates will meet, much as the presidential electors are supposed to and ratify the results of the election.

or and rathly the results of the election. Between now and the date of election, it will be necessary to establish the registration of all qualified voters, and also between now and August 19, othereabouts, candidates for delegates are to be extended to the control of the con

nosen. To be an aspirant as nominee for delegate it is To be an aspirant as nominee for detegate it is necessary to secure names on a petition, the 21 persons on each side (for repeal and against repeal) who secure the greatest number of names of qualified electors to their petitions being declared the

nominees by the secretary of state.

Voting by the people all over the state on election day will be on the two tickets of 21 names each. It will be possible to vote either for all 21 favoring or opposing repeal, or on individual delegates on both sides. Manifestly, whichever group is elected, or for that matter if 11 delegates on either side are or that matter if it delegates on either side are elected, then by controlling the convention to assemble October 17, the wishes of the majority of the people of the state for or against repeal of the Eighteenth amendment will have been recorded.
