Administration Seeking Curbs On Production Increasing To Avoid Shutdown

AIM AT FINDING JOBS

Johnson Promises Fighting Campaign to Put Men Back to Work

WASHINGTON, June 21 (AP)—American industry is being asked by the national industrial recovery administration to clear an armistice on increases in production so that the expected movement toward better times may be on an orderly, substantial basis.

Administrator Hugh S. Johnson revealed this objective as he promised fighting "put men back to work" campaign.

Other branches of the government kept pace with the dynamic Johnson and pushed forward in their factors of the economic offensive.

Assistant Coordinator Joseph B. Eastman continued his efforts to lead the railroads to abandon price-fixing.

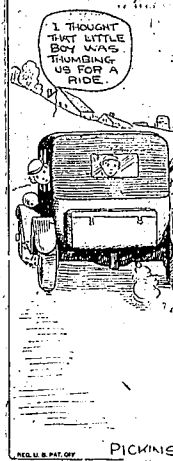

THE REPEAL QUESTION

Soon the beer problem will be out of the way, it is to be hoped, and then this state can devote the next three months to the election...

Voting by the people all over the state on election day will be on the two tickets of 21 names each. It will be possible to vote either for all 21 favoring or opposing repeal, or on individual delegates on both sides.

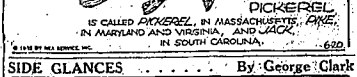

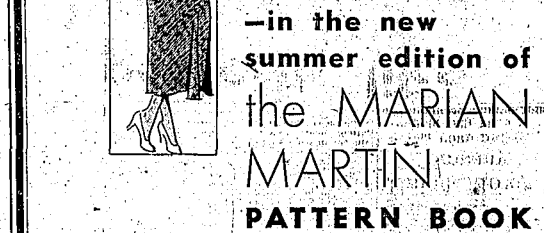
