**EXPERIENCE IS NEEDED**

The supplemental report of the congressional committee which investigated the Akron airship disaster contains one thing which it seems that the naval authorities might well adopt forthwith.

It has to do with certain different combinations of hydrogen and oxygen, as for instance if you take one part hydrogen to two parts oxygen—that is, when you come to weight it, allowing for waste and the heft of the container—the idea being that the chemical compounds—but in order to get it right you really ought to be a scientist, yourself. It is easy to understand if you happen to be a scientist yourself, and are interested in a serious way—that is as a phenomenon and not simply something to put under bridges, as in Kentucky, say.

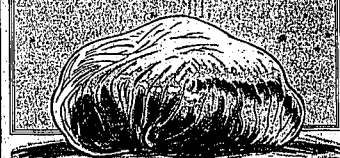

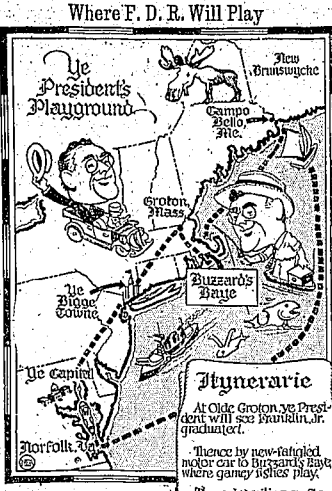

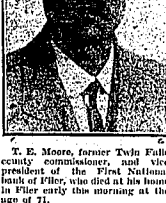
