The day of great gifts to colleges and universities is just about over; if a recent appeal from President Nicholas Murray. Buther of Columbia University to Columbia alumni is taken as a criterion.

In this appeal President Buther urged support of the university through small gifts. In the past Columbia has been very fortunate in getting many large donations. But now, says President Buther:

"The great fortunes and the large accumulations which made these benefactions possible are either dissipated or destroyed. The economic and financial crisis which grips the whole world has made their return quite impossible, certainly for a long time to come, if not forgree?"
