NEW YORK, June 29 (UP)—Arrogantly proud and deadly vengeance, Jack Sharkey, who learned to sling leather in the news tonight will attempt his first defense of the world heavyweight boxing championship against Primo Carnera, the Italian giant who battered Bob's buddy and fighter, Ernie Schaaf, into a coma from fear when he was 17.

Should weather make the outdoor bout impossible tonight, it will be held indoors at Madison Square Garden.

Sharkey was promised for today. With a good fight, added to the stakes of gold and glory, their 15-round bout at Madison Square Garden's boxing ring will be one of the greatest, old-fashioned brawls in years. About 150,000 fans were expected to witness it.
