GOLD PAYMENTS CLOSURES VOIDED BY TEST RULING

Colorado Court Verdict—Sum As Having Valid Bearing Over Contracts

LEGAL TENDER ORDERED

Judge Decries Note Holders Cannot Force Debtors To Offer Metal

FORT MORGAN, Colo., Mar. 1 (AP)—Gold clauses in money contracts were made inoperative today when District Judge Arlington Taylor ruled that the holder of a note cannot demand payment in anything except legal tender.

Judge Taylor cited the impossibility of obtaining gold legally and ruled that "performance of a contract cannot be completed where it would involve a violation of the law."

The ruling, which is thought to be the first made by a federal court in the United States, may have an important bearing on other gold contracts, and to total \$122,000,000,000, a sum many times greater than the value of the world's gold supply.

Omaha Firm Involved Judge Taylor made his order in connection with a suit filed by Howard Kemery, trustee for the Peters Trust company, of Omaha, Neb., to recover \$200,000 representing principal, interest and attorney's fees on a promissory note for \$7,000, executed July 28, 1923 and extended Sept. 1, 1933.

Kemery sought foreclosure because the defendants were unable to pay their September interest. The note was issued by the principal and interest in both the original note and the extension.

The defendants claimed inability to pay in gold because of the ban on the metal since Oct. 10, 1933, and offered legal tender. (Continued on Page 2, Column 2)

RELIGION GAINING, MINISTERS TOLD

Attendance, Interest Reveal Increase in Northwest, Bishop Declares

There is a growing religious consciousness as shown by greater church attendance, larger Sunday schools and more active interest in religious everywhere, was declared this afternoon by Bishop Titus Luvoe, Portland, who gave the concluding address at the joint convention of eastern district Methodist Episcopal ministers there.

Methodist Episcopal ministers in the Northwest are becoming more encouraging than in the declining days of the 1920's. In his talk, which was directed principally to ministers by episcopally appointed speakers, he pointed to the times in which we are living. Preachers must adapt themselves to the present, to the changing social and economic conditions, he said.

Another speaker, Dr. Mark Dauber, Philadelphia, member of the board of home missions, said that the present situation of the church is a challenge to its leadership. He too, emphasized the growth of religious interest, but it stressed the need of an ethical consciousness in present-day thinking. Dr. (Continued on Page 2, Column 2)

BROAD POWERS GIVEN PREMIER

French Deputies Grant Wide Authority to Doumergue Under Emergency

PARIS, Mar. 1 (AP)—France reacted today. Rooseveltian era in politics during which Premier Gaston Doumergue and his cabinet, calling themselves "dictators," will govern the country on the road to industrial and economic recovery.

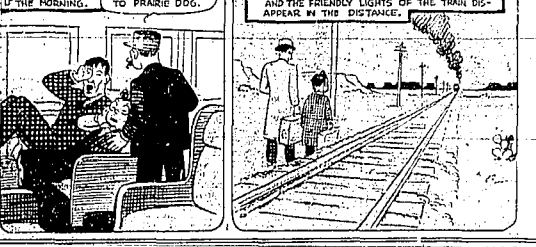
