

To put through a general shifting of personnel and principles that would give us two big parties, each one more or less united from top to bottom, based on widely different conceptions of the functions of government in the modern world; might be an exceedingly healthy development.

It is hard to escape the feeling that the actual trend of things today is in that direction.

We have the "western progressives" in the Republican party, who are far closer to the administration than they are to each leader in their new terms.
