THE DOG NUISANCE

The fown of McGraw, N. Y., has got into the head-lines recently because of the misbehavior of some pet dogs owned by its citizens. Four dogs attacked a little girl, mangled her arm so badly that it may have to be amputated—and were, as a result, sen-tenced to death by a justice of the peace. Here is just the sort of item that is sure to arouse the indignation of dog-lovers. But it also contains a useful little lesson for those of us who like to keep dogs as pets.

A dog which is surly or vicious is a neighborhood nuisance, and often is an actual menace to public safety. The man who owns such a dog owes it to his neighbors to keep it caged or tethered at all times. CRIME CONTROL

Few Americans are apt to quarrel with Attorney General Cummings' plea that broad powers be given the federal government to move against gangsters, kidnapers, racketeers and other criminals. The offensive against organized crime has taken on new life in recent months. A nation that looked on its crime record with more or less complacency for a long time seems at last to be determined to do something about it.

There is one sure recipe for stamping out the kidnaping racket. That is to catch the kidnapers and put them safely away where they will not commit any more offenses.

During recent months the authorities have been giving this recipe a trial, and it has been working beautifully. That the Touhy gang was unable to escape in this general roundup is a matter for re-

escape in this general roundup is a matter for rejoicing.

To be sure, not all kidnaping cases have been
solved, and not all of these most infamous of racketeers have been put behind bars. But an excellent
start, has been made.
